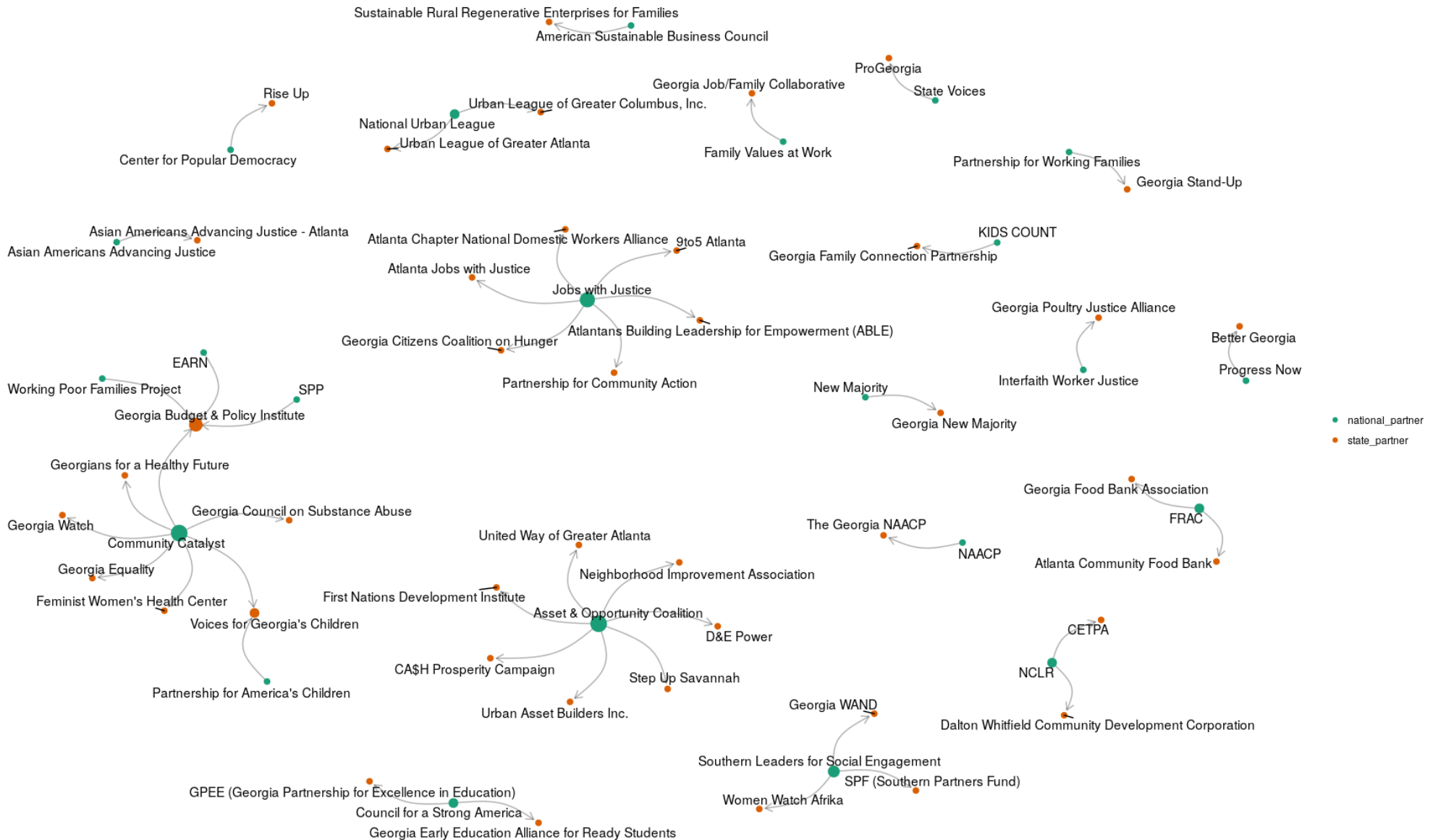


Georgia National Network Ecosystem

Georgia Network Analysis

The statewide ecosystem is dispersed in Georgia. While there are many organizations working in the state, they tend to be distinct. There are 23 national networks working in the state, supporting 42 state partners. These numbers show the limited overlap between networks. 15 national networks (65%) have only one state partner in Georgia.

Overlapping network system

There is a one overlapping network system in the state ecosystem. Two state partners – Georgia Budget & Policy Institute and Voices for Georgia’s Children – are supported by multiple national networks. The Georgia Budget & Policy Institute is supported by four national networks – Working Poor Families Project, EARN, SPP, and Community Catalyst. Voices for Georgia’s Children is supported by two national networks – Community Catalyst and Partnership for America’s Children. Community Catalyst works with five additional organizations in Georgia for a total of seven state partners.

National networks with no overlap

18 national networks (78%) do not have any shared state group partners in the state. They do not overlap with other national networks. They are:

National networks with deep connections to the state

Some networks show particularly deep connections in Georgia by working with many state groups, including:

- Jobs with Justice – 6 state groups (no overlap)
- Southern Leaders for Social Engagement – 3 state groups (no overlap)
- Council for a Strong America – 2 state groups (no overlap)
- FRAC – 2 state groups (no overlap)
- National Urban League – 2 state groups (no overlap)
- NCLR – 2 state groups (no overlap)
