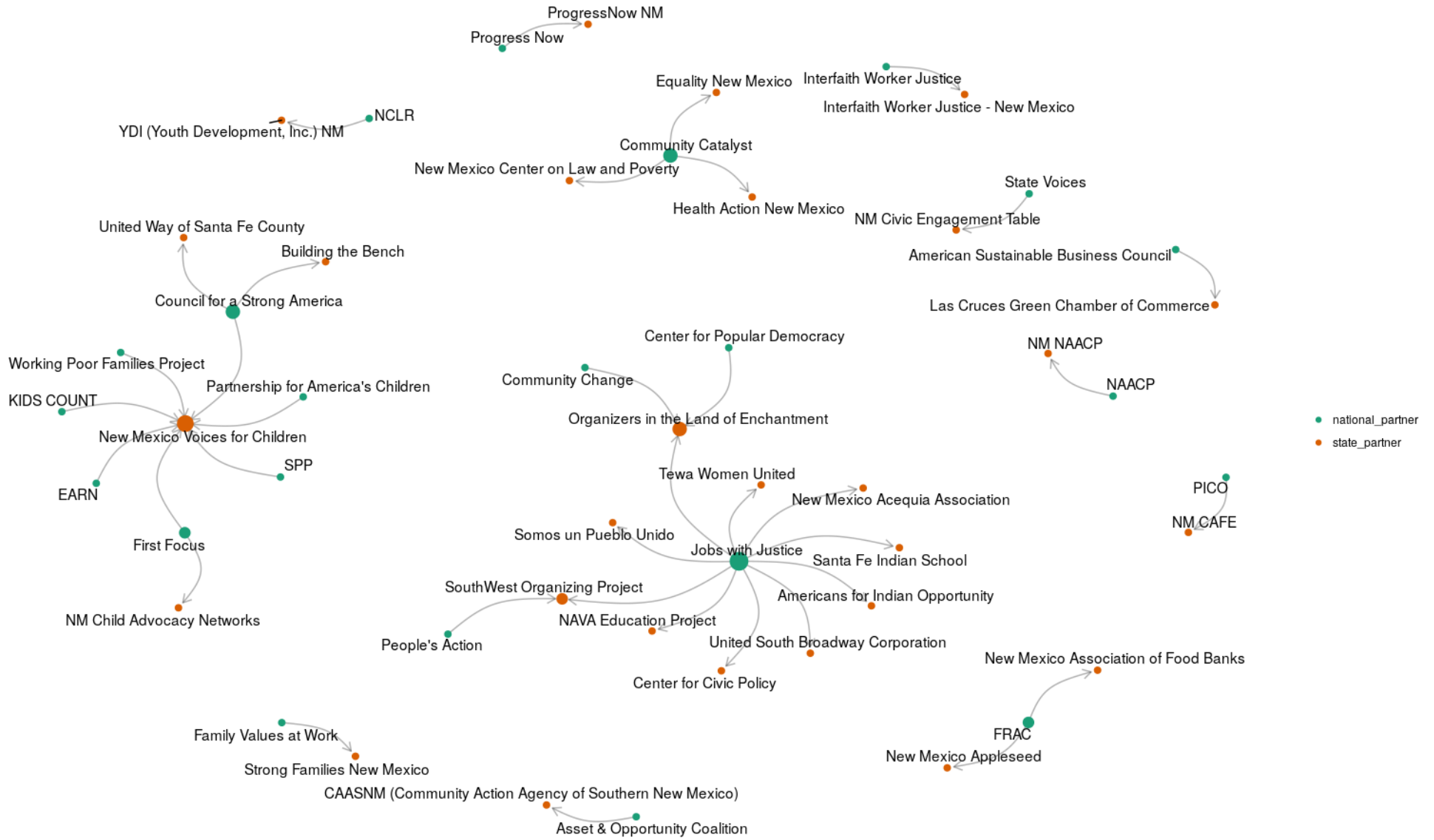


New Mexico National Network Ecosystem

National Networks & State Partners in New Mexico



New Mexico Network Analysis

There are 22 national networks working in New Mexico, supporting 28 state partners.

Child-Centered Network Cluster: New Mexico Voices for Children

One state partner, New Mexico Voices for Children, is supported by 7 national networks. For five of these networks, New Mexico Voices for Children is their only partner in the state. However, two of these networks – Council for a Strong America and First Focus – also support other state partners. Council for a Strong America has 3 state partners in New Mexico – New Mexico Voices for Children, United Way of Santa Fe County, and Building the Bench. First Focus has two – New Mexico Voices for Children and NM Child Advocacy Networks.

Community Organizing Network Cluster

Jobs with Justice works with 10 organizations in New Mexico. Two of these – Organizers in the Land of Enchantment (OLE) and SouthWest Organizing Project – are also supported by other national networks. OLE works with 3 national networks – Jobs with Justice, Community Change, and Center for Popular Democracy. SouthWest Organizing Project works with two – Jobs with Justice and People’s Action.

National networks with no overlap

11 national networks (50%) do not have any shared state group partners in the state. They do not overlap with other national networks. They are:

National networks with deep connections to the state

Some networks show particularly deep connections in Georgia by working with many state groups, including:

- Jobs with Justice – 10 state groups (community organizing network)
- Community Catalyst – 3 state groups (no overlap)
- Council for a Strong America – 3 state groups (child-centered network)
- First Focus – 2 state groups (child-centered network)
- FRAC – 2 state groups (no overlap)
