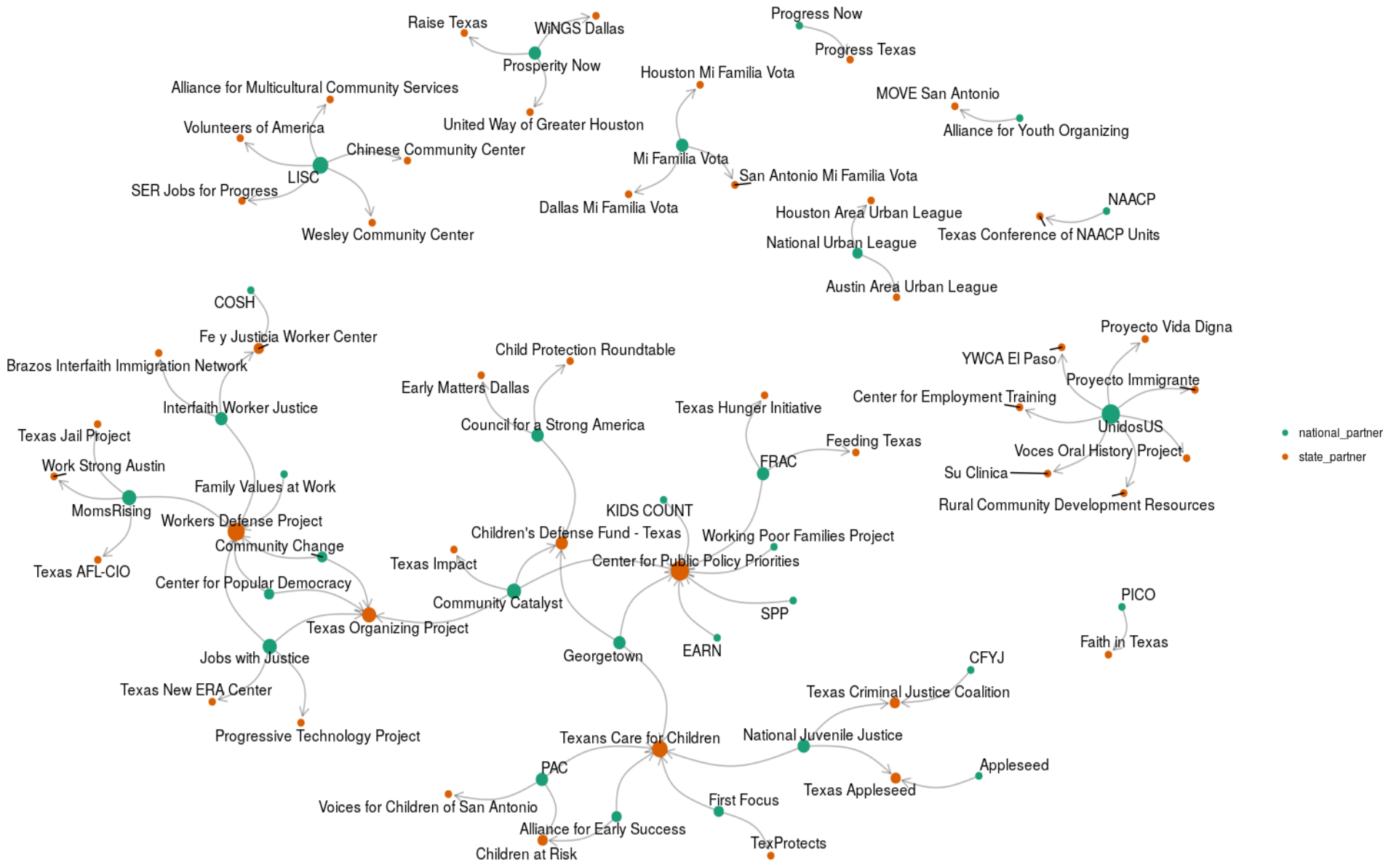


Texas National Network Ecosystem

Texas Network Analysis

There are 30 national networks working in Texas, supporting 46 state partners.

Key connector organizations

The Center for Public Policy Priorities works with seven national networks – Community Catalyst, Georgetown, EARN, SPP, the Working Poor Families Project, FRAC, and KIDS COUNT. This organization connects the kids, budget, and nutrition groups.

Children's organizations

There are a handful of state partners working on children's issues (located towards the bottom of the map). The key connectors for these issue areas are:

- Texans Care for Children – 5 national networks (Georgetown, National Juvenile Justice Network, First Focus, Alliance for Early Success, and PAC)
- Children's Defense Fund – Texas – 3 national networks (Community Catalyst, Council for a Strong America, and Georgetown)
- Children at Risk – 2 national networks (PAC and Alliance for Early Success)
- Texas Appleseed – 2 national networks (National Juvenile Justice Network and Appleseed)
- Texas Criminal Justice Coalition – 2 national networks (CFYJ and National Juvenile Justice Network)

These children's organizations are linked to the budget and nutrition groups through Georgetown's partnership with the Center for Public Policy Priorities and to the organization groups through Community Catalyst's work with the Texas Organizing Project.

Organizing & workers justice organizations

To the lower left side of the map, there is a cluster of organizations all focused on organizing and workers' rights. The key connectors are:

- Workers Defense Project – 6 networks (MomsRising, Interfaith Worker Justice, Family Values at Work, Community Change, Center for Popular Democracy, and Jobs with Justice)
- Texas Organizing Project – 4 networks (Jobs with Justice, Center for Popular Democracy, Community Change, and Community Catalyst)
- Fe y Justicia Worker Center – 2 networks (COSH and Interfaith Worker Justice)

National networks with no overlap

9 national networks (30%) do not have any shared state group partners in the state. They do not overlap with other national networks. Located along the top and right of the map, they are:
